Unique Shark Bay outback experience open for business

A stunning slice of the Western Australian coastline is officially available for people to visit following the 2019 season opening of Bush Heritage Australia's Hamelin Outback Station Stay.

This unique Station Stay is located at national conservation organisation Bush Heritage's Hamelin Station Reserve—a 202,000 hectare nature reserve bordering the Shark Bay World Heritage Area.

Formerly a sheep station, Hamelin was purchased by Bush Heritage for conservation back in 2015, and has undergone significant ecological restoration since then. It provides habitat for 240 species of birds, 820 species of plants and many other mammals and reptiles.

Travellers also come from far and wide to view the world famous Hamelin Pool stromatolites. These ancient rock-like structures are built by cyanobacteria and are modern examples of the first life on earth – representative of life forms that lived 3.5 billion years ago.

They're just a hop, skip and a jump from the Station Stay so don't miss your chance to visit the largest and most diverse examples of stromatolites in the world.

Lucky visitors might also spot the Western Grasswren, a beautiful bird with a distinctive squeaky song that can be seen bouncing around in dense wattle shrubland.

Accommodation is available at the Station Stay's restored shearer's quarters, or at one of the 30 unpowered camping sites.

So immerse yourself in the beauty of Shark Bay and explore the ecological delights of a Station Stay based on a conservation reserve by booking your stay today!

The Hamelin Outback Station Stay is open NOW until November 2019.
