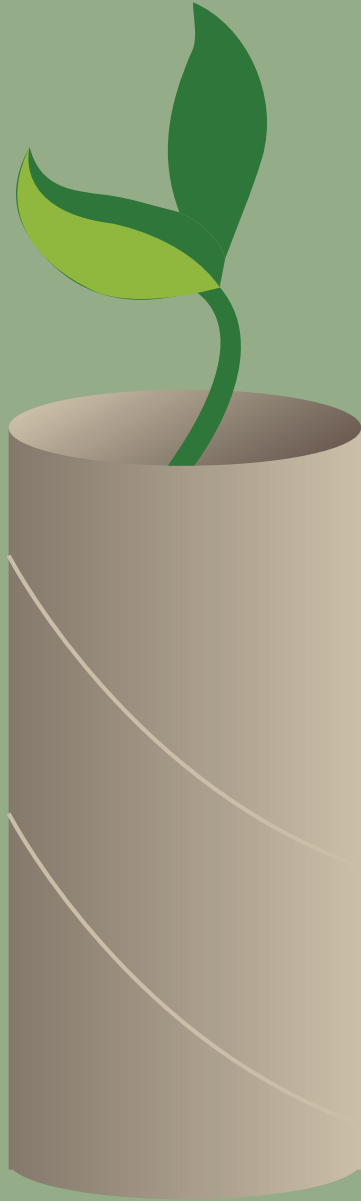


If you want a bit of an adventure and you have the space, try renting a beehive or some chooks, and find out what they can bring into your life. Chooks are wonderful for children.



A small worm farm can work even on a terrace and can turn kitchen waste into food and drink for your indoor plants or veggie beds, or your neighbours' plants.





Use the cardboard tube inside your toilet rolls, stacked together vertically and filled with potting mix to grow your own plants, cuttings or veggie seedlings. Then you just drop them in a hole in the garden/pot/veggie bed and they rot down as compost, and there is no replanting stress on the seedlings.

Participate in the urban gardening explosion and add some veggie beds to the back garden or terrace. You can be eating your own greens and radishes in about four weeks! Tomatoes take a bit longer but are worth the wait.
